The seminar will also consider the development in local judicial and legislative temperaments in their respective treatments of the principle of extraterritoriality with respect to laws governing drugs, serious crime, corruption and cybercrime; where applicable, the approach taken by other jurisdictions to the applicability of principles of extra-territoriality in similar areas will also be explored.
