Dr. Colin Ong is a member of the Brunei, English and Singapore Bars. He has acted as arbitrator or as counsel in many commercial and investment arbitrations under most major rules of arbitration governed under Civil and Common Law. His arbitrations generally involve cases concerning banking and finance, construction and infrastructure projects, insurance, mining and minerals disputes, energy disputes (coal mining and supply disputes, production sharing contracts, electricity generation and supply, gas contracts; oil exploration joint ventures; solar and wind), information technology, shipping, telecoms, technology transfer, and general commercial trade related matters.

Listed by Global Arbitration Review as one of the 45 under 45. He is a Chartered Arbitrator and a Master of the Bench of the Inner Temple. President, Arbitration Association Brunei Darussalam; Advisory Board, BANI (Indonesia); Board, Cambodia National Commercial Arbitration Centre; Vice President, Appointments Council, Thailand Arbitration Center (THAC) and Advisor to China-ASEAN Legal Research Center.

Andrew Ang - Partner; Head (Corporate/Mergers and Acquisitions Practice), WongPartnership LLP (General Company Law)

Andrew Ang is the Head of the Corporate/Mergers & Acquisitions Practice and is a Partner in the Private Equity Practice. His main practice areas are local and cross-border mergers and acquisitions, corporate restructurings, joint ventures, privatisations as well as private equity investments.

In the area of public M&A, Andrew has been involved in many landmark deals, including acting for Frasers Centrepoint Limited in the acquisition of Australand Property Group. This deal was awarded "Best Singapore Deal" at the FinanceAsia Awards for Achievement 2014; United Industrial Corporation Limited in the S\$761 million acquisition of Singapore Land Limited; Guthrie GTS Limited in the S\$949 acquisition made by United SM Holdings Pte. Ltd.; Kindest Place Groups Limited in relation to Heineken International B.V.'s acquisition of Asia Pacific Breweries Limited. The acquisition won several awards including the "Global M&A Deal of the Year: Southeast Asia" at The American Lawyer's Global Legal Awards, 2013, "SE Asia Deal of the Year" and "IPP Financial Advisers Pte Ltd Award Singapore M&A Deal of the Year" at the ALB SE Asia Awards, 2013, amongst others. Andrew also acted for TCCA Assets Limited ("TCCA") in relation to the mandatory general offer by TCCA for Fraser and Neave, Limited ("F&N"), which values F&N at approximately S\$13.8 billion. The transaction was awarded "M&A Deal of the Year" for both South East Asia and Singapore, as well as "SE Asia Deal of the Year" at the ALB SE Asia Law Awards, 2014; and "Best M&A Deal" at the IFLR Asia Awards, 2014.

Goh Yihan – Associate Professor, Singapore Management of University (Contract)

Goh Yihan is an Associate Professor of Law and Associate Dean (Research) at the School of Law, Singapore Management University. He is also a Visiting Academic at Rajah & Tann Singapore LLP, and a board member of the Singapore Judicial College and the Singapore Institute of Legal Education. His research focuses primarily on the law of contract and torts, with a secondary interest in the principles of statutory interpretation and the legal process. He has published numerous books, chapters and journal articles internationally and in Singapore, which have been cited on multiple occasions by the Singapore courts. In recognition of his invaluable contributions to the development and advancement of Singapore law, he received the Singapore Academy of Law Singapore Law Merit Award in 2013.



Kumaralingam Amirthalingam – Professor, Faculty of Law; Chair, NUS Teaching Academy, National University of Singapore (Tort)

Kumaralingam Amirthalingam obtained his LLB (Hons) and PhD in law from the Australian National University where he commenced his academic career. He joined the Faculty of Law, National University of Singapore in 2000 and over the years has served as Vice Dean (Academic Affairs), Vice Dean (International Programmes) and Director, Asian Law Institute. He is presently the Chair of the NUS Teaching Academy and serves on various faculty and university committees. From 2012 to 2014, he was on secondment to the Attorney-General's Chambers, Singapore as a Deputy Public Prosecutor and Senior Director (Research & Policy). His research is primarily in the areas of criminal law and justice (focusing on the role of the Public Prosecutor), and in tort law (focusing on economic loss and medical liability).

Tang Hang Wu – Professor and Director, Centre of Cross-Border Commercial Law in Asia, Singapore Management University; Consultant, TSMP Law Corporation (Restitution/Trust)

Tang Hang Wu is a Professor at the School of Law, Singapore Management University and a consultant at TSMP Law Corporation where he co-heads the Trusts and Private Wealth practice. Hang Wu has published widely and his work has been relied on by all levels of the Singapore courts, the Royal Court of Jersey, the Caribbean Court of Appeal, the Federal Court of Malaysia, law reform committees in the Commonwealth, major textbooks and law journals. He has acted as Counsel both in the High Court and Court of Appeal on matters involving property, equity, trust, restitution and charities. In recognition of his expertise in Chancery work, Hang Wu was made an overseas member of the Chancery Bar Association of England and Wales, a country correspondent of Trusts and Trustees and a member of the STEP's Contentious Trusts and Estate Group.



Yeong Zee Kin - Assistant Chief Executive and Commission Member, Personal Data Protection Commission (PDPC), Singapore (Personal Data Protection)

Yeong Zee Kin is a Technology, Media and Telecommunications (TMT) lawyer. Prior to taking up his present appointment as Assistant Chief Executive and Commission Member of the Personal Data Protection Commission, he was Senior State Counsel and Director of Technology Law in the Civil Division of the Attorney-General's Chambers and held a concurrent appointment as Senior Director (Special Projects) in the Legal Services department of the Ministry of Communications and Information. He was also legal advisor to the Smart Nation Programme Office and the Cyber Security Agency.

Before this, he was Senior Assistant Registrar and CIO cum CDO of the Supreme Court of Singapore. During his time in the Supreme Court, his administrative responsibilities included (at various times) the management of its registry, statistics unit and CISD. He managed the Supreme Court's Shipping, Intellectual Property, Information Technology and Employment lists. He developed specialised procedures for managing IP cases, eventually collating them and issuing the Supreme Court IP Court Guide. He continues to be engaged in procedural law reform as a member of the Ministry of Law's IP Dispute Resolution Framework Review Committee and the Supreme Court's Civil Justice Commission.
