



## IMPERSONATION OF SINGAPORE LAW PRACTICE – 6 MAY 2026

### **E-mail purporting to be from a Singapore Law Practice**

The Law Society of Singapore has been notified that an email purporting to be from Nanyang Law LLC was sent to a third-party.

The email was sent by a person using a Gmail address and contained the following particulars:

- (a) the law firm's name;
- (b) a fabricated business address;
- (c) a fabricated contact number;
- (d) a fabricated e-mail address; and
- (e) the name of a fictitious legal practitioner.

Should you receive such correspondence and doubt its authenticity, please **be vigilant** and contact the Singapore Law Practice directly for verification.

### **Risk Management Tips**

- Please remind your friends, colleagues, and clients to perform direct verification checks with you and/or your law firm, should they receive any correspondence (e.g. e-mails containing attachments) purporting to be from your law firm, especially if no prior contact has been made.
- To check whether a legal practitioner and/or law firm in Singapore is registered with the Legal Services Regulatory Authority (“**LSRA**”), please perform a search on the LSRA's integrated search function at - <https://eservices.mlaw.gov.sg/lra/search-lawyer-or-law-firm/>. This same search function may be used to verify the telephone number of a Singapore Law Practice.
