



## IMPERSONATION OF SINGAPORE LAW PRACTICE – 5 JUNE 2026

### **Letter purporting to be from a Singapore Law Practice**

The Law Society of Singapore has been notified that a forged letter bearing a Singapore Law Practice's name and logo (the "**Forged Letter**") was received by their former client's relative.

The Forged Letter requested that the former client pay the Singapore Law Practice legal fees in connection with a purported settlement with a local bank and directed that payment be made to a fictitious employee.

The Singapore Law Practice has informed the former client's relative that the Forged Letter is to be disregarded.

A police report has been filed by the Singapore Law Practice.

### **Risk Management Tips**

- Please remind your friends, colleagues, and clients to perform direct verification checks with you and/or your law firm, should they receive any correspondence (e.g. e-mails and/or letters) purporting to be from your law firm, especially if no prior contact has been made.
- Should there be any doubts as to the authenticity of any correspondence which is purported to be from a Singapore Law Practice, please contact the Singapore Law Practice directly for verification.
- To check whether a legal practitioner and/or law firm in Singapore is registered with the Legal Services Regulatory Authority ("**LSRA**"), please perform a search on the LSRA's integrated search function at - <https://eservices.mlaw.gov.sg/lra/search-lawyer-or-law-firm/>. This same search function may be used to verify the telephone number of a Singapore Law Practice.
